I'm talking about the paper, the right hand or left hand. Now I don't care really what you do about General File only I have a couple of bills up there and I was going to let them go this session and I'm going to let them go this session because January of 74 is soon enough. There is no hurry for them because you can't do anything until 74 about them anyhow. I don't care what bills you bring up, I have no personal bill in there that any thing that I have in there can be delayed until 74. That is why I have one of them bracketed and when the other one came up I was going to have it bracketed. No hurry on mine, so I don't see why I should be forced to take up a bill that I don't want to take up this session. I'm probably unique in this thing, and I have talked to some other Senators and they don't want them this session. They want them in 74 that is soon enough. Any constitutional amendment can be taken up in 74 just as good as now in fact it is better. So why should I be forced to take up something that I don't want to take up. I was going to let the rest of you be a good guy and let the rest of you take up yours.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the motion. I have no desire to get into a clam bake this morning.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Carpenter asking unanimous consent to withdraw his motion regarding the order on General File. Are there objections to his withdrawing the motion?

SENATOR BURBACH: I want to talk on the motion. I don't yet if I want to or not, I want to talk on it. I want to get some respond.

PRESIDENT: Alright, go ahead.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well Mr. President, members of the legislature all of the bills starting at 472, 577, 246, 275, 549, 267, 533, 526, 29, 530 and that is where I stop because those are the ones 530, 26 and 29 bear my name. So, all of these have been set for a date certain. 526, 29 and 30 for last Monday. Now I think that those bills should be taken right down the line right...one after the other one. We have the accepted the delay because of dates certain on 509, 510 and 511 and so forth. So I think that we must go that far on those bills which a have been set for a date certain without any other course to be followed. I think that we are automatically in that position whether we have that this amendment or not and if he wants to withdraw it, I don't object but I think that that is the policy that we should follow right straight down the line. So I don't have an objection to it and I think that certainly that is the route that we will be taking.

PRESIDENT: Then you are suggesting that we just stay locked in on the present system as we are. Alright. If there are no objections then Senator Proud, do you withdrawal motion?

SENATOR PROUD: No, I have no objection.
