

PRESIDENT: Lets withdraw the motion then and go on....

SENATOR PROUD: I have another announcement when you are ready.

PRESIDENT: Alright, fine. Senator Stahmer did you wish to be heard on some issue here. We have withdrawn the motion. Senator Whitney, Senator Carpenter withdrew his motion.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Point a personal privilege and I do want to speak on the subject just a little.

PRESIDENT: State your point Senator.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Would it be desirable for all of us who have bills on General File to bracket them at the bottom so that then they will know how many we prefer not to take up this particular session. If that were done then we could tell just about what our work load is going to be. I would like to have somebody, I would personally like to do that, I've got a bill up there that doesn't need to be passed this session and I would just as soon bracket it at the bottom. Then everybody would know that we are not interested in having that bill discussed.

PRESIDENT: Does somebody care to respond to that?

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, No, I don't care to respond to that that is OK, if anybody wants to delay their bill we can do this without any motion, it is a time for suggestions. Let me point out something, yesterday I spoke on this rather reluctantly because it is the responsibility of the Chair to spell out our work and he did this. Now when Senator Proud was discussing this this morning he pointed out the difference between his proposal and the proposal we have before us that I laid on your desk yesterday morning. There is a difference of 83 days on General File or 85. I think that is the crux of it. I think that we must make a determination if we want to use 85 days we will have to be here as Senator Proud explained to us and June 7 would be the day. If we want to do our work and go home the General File on the 83rd day then the second column or the middle column with this explanation over to the right would be the procedure to follow. Now whether we are here June 1 or June 7 or whatever days assuming that Emery Burnette is right that is the column we can follow. I think that the first determination that we must make here now is do we want to be shut off General File after the 83rd day or the 85th day, and then we could make a determination and the rest falls into place then automatically.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Proud.

SPEAKER PROUD: I would like to correct Senator Burbach here on one thing just technical, the last day for General File whichever way you look at it is the 83rd day. The difference comes in the calendar days May 15 under the one plan would be the last day for General File and May 17 under the other plan would be the last day. They are both on the 83rd day.

BURBACH: (mike not activated in time to get first part of statement) schedule I am not talking about this schedule only in the middle column and your schedule as you offered it yesterday as we turned down. That was for 85 days. This both of these columns refer to 83 days. On General File. Your provision provides for 85 days.
