

SENATOR BURBACH: Look at your sheet, the one that you presented to us yesterday.

SPEAKER PROUD: Yes, I was speaking from the one that you had prepared.

SENATOR BURBACH: No, no, please don't do that. Look at your own chart that you presented to us yesterday. Then compare it with the center column here or either the right or left column and they both stop at 83 days. Yours stop at 85 days. I think that we must decide whether we want to shut off General File on the 83rd day or the 85th day. Your schedule is not a part of this one. Your schedule indicated that the 7th of June would be the earliest that we could get out of here.

SPEAKER PROUD: Yes, that is correct.

SENATOR BURBACH: That would be allowing for 85 days on General File.

SPEAKER PROUD: Well, looking at your schedule, in both columns the last day for General File is the 83rd day, right? Senator Burbach if you look at the schedule that you prepared, both columns the last day for general file is the 83rd day.

SENATOR BURBACH: This is what I am trying to tell you sir. This sheet that I placed on your desk, or had placed on your desk shuts everything off on the 83rd day on General File. The one that your proposing....or the one that you proposed to us yesterday allowed 85 days on General File. That would have been the....

SPEAKER PROUD: Senator, it doesn't make any difference, there is a final day, if you are going to go a 90 day session there is a final legislative day when the bills can be on General File and get across the board, right? It doesn't make any difference whose schedule it is.

SENATOR BURBACH: No, that is right.

SPEAKER PROUD: And the 83rd day is the last day, for General File.

SENATOR BURBACH: That does not need to be.

SPEAKER PROUD: OK, let me put it this way then. Regardless of that I think that the one thing that we have to do right now is to make a decision on what our plan is. No matter whose plan it is and I could care less. If it is to take things day by day, that is alright with me, but I received a call yesterday from the Secretary of the Omaha Chamber of Commerce and they don't know what to do, and they are assuming, and I told them that they could assume that the members who had so indicated will make that trip there Tuesday afternoon. We have got to decide right now, or we should, what we are going to do. Maybe Senator Mahoney has a comment on this.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, the answer to that is in the Burbach's plan that we would work Tuesday and we would start at 8:00 in the morning and we would quit here about 5 or 6 good solid hours of work and everybody that wanted to take the boat ride with the Chamber of Commerce would be able to do so and go to their dinner. So we would not disturb Tuesday at all. We would still have a good work day but on this one occasion instead of starting at 9:00, Senator Syas and Senator Mahoney will get up a little bit earlier and be the two that
