We are delighted to have them here today. I think that probably some of those are sponsors and we are glad to have you here. Additionally we have 48 7th grade students from Horace Mann Junior from Omaha and they are from Senator Chambers district. Then their instructor is Mrs. Benjamin and Mrs. Mobly. They are seated in the south balcony and also we have 18 7th and 8th grade students from the Burchard Public Schools that are from Senator Wiltse district and three adults and their instructor is Mrs. McCall and they are seated in the south balcony in case the senator is interested. We have 11 6th and eighth grade students from district four in Grand Island, and that is Senator Kelly's district, I think that he is not here today. We have Mildred Wagner and Ellen Grossheart. Then we have 38 7th and 8th grade students from Orchard Public Schools of Orchard, Nebraska that is Senator DeCamp's district and he is up there with them I believe in the north balcony. Their instructors are Mrs. Staub and Mr. Teachout and there are four adults with them and we are just delighted to have all of you here today as observers to the Nebraska very unique non-partisan Nebraska Unicameral Legislature. We hope that you enjoy your visit to the capital city and also to the deliberations here today. We sometimes observe that this sure beats going to school. Now, part of the Grand Island group is Senator Stromer's district. Very good. Alright we are delighted to have you here. Now if the Chair remembers correctly we still have the Maresh amendment to the Warner amendment and a...a..Senator Duis that is all that is before the body at this time.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes sir Mr. Speaker, lets simplify this if we might just a little bit. I think that we are going to have several amendments and as Senator Keyes says he likes to have them written out, lets start from someplace, so lets adopt the Warner amendments as they are now then you can do your amending from then on and we have got someplace to start from otherwise we are not going to be able to start from anyplace, so I would like to make the motion...well I guess the motion is made to adopt these amendments but I would ask Senator Maresh if you might withdraw your motion so that we can adopt these amendments so that you can start amending them and lets start from somplace because I'm sure that somebody besides you has amendments that they wish to offer too. If we amend as we go along we are going to get pretty confused.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis, the Chair would only observe that Senator Maresh's motion is in order....

SENATOR DUIS: I understand that his motion is in order, but I understand that we have not adopted the Warner amendments as of yet, is this correct?

PRESIDENT: Yes, that is correct.

SENATOR DUIS: Well alright, we could adopt these amendments then they could amend and there is going to be more than one of them and we won't be sitting here with each amendment coming up and then trying to adopt the amendment...the amended amendment if he would withdraw his motion to amend we could go ahead and adopt these amendments and proceed with the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis except that we do have the technicality that each amendment then becomes a reconsideration and takes 25 votes. If you really want to be technical about it that is the
