

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Ready to vote? All those in favor of the amendment say aye, those opposed say no. Amendment is adopted. Any further amendments Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Read

SPEAKER: Senator Murphy

SENATOR MURPHY: May I defer to Senator Burbach, I don't believe that reprint has been put on the desk just yet. You do have them? Fine. This amendment to conform with the school aid program takes into account the student known as a free tuition student. At this time there is no fixed cost determination for these students. There is in elementary but there is not in secondary. So in the secondary category this will apply substantially the same formula that would apply to the elementary that is specific and it is additionally incorporates a 20% increase in the cost as determined annually by the county superintendent for every specific school. I think that this is the only way the increase in sales and income tax that the people in this particular category are paying would be reflected in their particular cost.

SPEAKER: Is there further discussion? Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Murphy, I think that the one that you are talking about and I don't think that we are discussing the amendment that I have that I placed on your desk at this time. I don't know who put this amendment on.

SENATOR MURPHY: This is a separate amendment Senator Burbach yours has been distributed, and I thought that mine had not and I was going to defer to you and yours, you and I have two different amendments.

CLERK: That is the Murphy amendment there you probably can't read his signature but that is it.

SENATOR BURBACH: Oh this is the Murphy amendment. I see. It has been decided Senator Murphy that we can't read your signature and that is why I am at loss as to who placed this amendment on our desks. The amendment that I placed on your desk is under discussion at this time I'm sure, is it?

CLERK: No, it comes next.

SPEAKER: The one under discussion Senator Burbach is Senator Murphy's amendment. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President I would support Senator Murphy's amendment so that it is understood that the amendment is similar to a bill that we killed in committee but this amendment was a part of the committee recommendation if state aid was increased. If state aid was not increased then the change in the law provided by the amendment would not be good. But it creates no problem in fact it stabilizes the receipts so that it is more uniform as far as it is arrived at and it also insures that those paying non-resident tuition receives the tax reduction by virtue of increased state aid. I think that it is a reasonable amendment and one that would assist the bill.
