

as Senator Warner says. I suppose that this really doesn't do too much one way or the other for my particular school district, but I wish to call to your attention to some of your rural districts that there are some of your districts that oppose this amendment when it was a bill in committee because they like it the way it is. Now this is a restriction. That is all I want to say. I just want you to be alert if you get some letters from your school districts that say to you why you went for this amendment. You can't say that you have not been alerted.

SPEAKER: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would just like to state that Senator Syas would be correct that if there is no change in the amount of state aid because then the bill as it was originally introduced by itself created some adverse problems but as a part of 472 and this was originally intended by the study committee that problem that was of concern before would not exist. I do not believe that there is a problem with the murphy amendment as long as it is a part of 472.

SPEAKER: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the legislature I would like to ask Senator Warner if this particular amendment is adopted Senator Warner, there will be a change in the fiscal impact of 472 would there not? Because the state would have to pick up the difference here, or a part of that difference is that right?

SENATOR WARNER: The effect would be minimal Senator Carsten because the tuition is counted as accountable receipts and they are only reimbursed up to \$750 of insured needs in any event. So there can not be any....I don't think that if there is any effect it is virtually none.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Well Senator Warner, it is my understanding that some of these districts that are charging non-resident tuition is pretty sizeable and if we adopt this amendment there is going to be a sizeable difference in the amount that these school districts can charge for non-residents.

SENATOR WARNER: It will reduce what they can charge. Well let me answer this way. The print-out that you have in effect would take into account the Murphy amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Oh, it does take that into....

SENATOR WARNER: As a practical matter it does.

SENATOR CARSTEN: OK, thank you sir.

SPEAKER: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Senator Murphy, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes sir.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Senator Murphy, will you explain that amendment again, a little bit more so that it will break it up. A little slower, I don't believe that I quite understand it.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well if I can and I would ask Senator Warner correct me when I get lost. Presently the county superintendent prepares an actual cost per pupil for the past year which is used as a basis for assessing county school levies. In the case
