CLERK: 26 Ayes, 5 Nays and 18 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Debate will close, Senator Burbach you may close.

SENATOR BURBACH: Very, very few words. This amendment is a worthwhile amendment and it will reach and adjust the local expenditures in those extreme cases. This is what it will do as I indicated before. It will not do all the things for all of the people for all times. We are here to adjust it any time in the future but it is a step in the right direction and I urge your vote for the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the Burbach amendment now be adopted? Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: A point of order. Isn't it required that a dollar figure be put in a case of this kind such a that the board would know what the amount would be in order that it could be administered?

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney the Chair would rule that that is not a point of order at this time on this particular amendment at all. Question is shall the Burbach be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Your voting on the Burbach amendment to LB472. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.
