

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Warner amendment?  
Senator Warner, back to you.

SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, if the obviously the kill motion passes there is no use taking up my amendment so I will just hold...or I will withdraw that motion for now until we see what happens to the kill motion.
