

SENATOR CARPENTER: The reason for it, I asked the TV Commission to give me a motion and in order to do something to get them into gear to try and correct it.

PRESIDENT: All those in favor of adopting the resolution say aye, those opposed say no. We better have a vote on that. All those in favor of adopting the resolution vote aye, those opposed vote no. It would be relatively ineffective if we can't get 25 votes for it. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 Ayes, 0 Nays

PRESIDENT: Motion is adopted. Senator....

CLERK: Read

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the legislature this bill was on General File at one time and it was returned to committee for public hearing and I would like very much to move the bill because it is very important to the live-stock industry that the bill become law this session and it shouldn't take but a minute.

PRESIDENT: Well ok, we have to read the title I think. Well do you want to give unanimous consent to read the title here? Hearing none.....

CLERK: Read

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The committee amendments provide that the department of agriculture can enter into agreement with the livestock markets in Omaha for the inspection of livestock when the federal government withdraws their inspectors July 1st. That is all the committee amendments do and that is all the bill does, and I move the committee amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the committee amendments? QUESTION IS, shall the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor say aye, those opposed say no. Back to you Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: (machine not activated for first part of statement) E & R initial.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is to advance LB535 to E & R initial all those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, those opposed vote no. Motion is to advance LB535. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 Ayes, 0 Nays.

PRESIDENT: LB535 is advanced.
