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or the year after or whatever and I think that we better keep this in mind and we better make sure we're very clear in our minds because we--it's a very fine line here that we're dealing with and if we're going to--if we're going to say one thing and do something else, well, I've said my piece and I know some other guys want to talk about this. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Next is Senator Kelly, then Murphy, Keyes, Duis.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. We started out on a course a few weeks ago that was just unprecedented. We were taking the taxpayer into our heart, we were going to save him some money. Now taxpayers are people and we are interested in people and we're interested in taxpaying people. Now if we're going to break the dam which I sure hope we don't do, but if we are going to break the dam for retired teachers, we certainly ought to break the dam for hungry kids and bring 235 up here and let's get some priority on the taxpayers' money that we're going to spend. Let's don't spend it but if we are going to spend it, let's take a choice. Let's take a choice between the elderly teacher and the malnourished children that can't learn from those teachers if they were working because they don't have proper food to go to school with. I'm not in favor of breaking the dam but if we do, let's keep our priorities where they belong. Now it is my intention Senator Lewis, to support 485 but I want to support it on the basis that we're going to spend the money, we're going to spend the \$15,000,000 that we decided not to. I would hate to try to choose one bill out of all of the propositions that we have to consider. I find it very easy to not consider any of them except the taxpayer in this session. Stay with our course, come back at a later date when the rules have not been set and consider all of the propositions at that time.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I would like to correct a misstatement I made earlier this session when we were discussing these monies. At that time I said the tax burden was .35¢ on the dollar. Yesterday Senators Proxmire and Block were discussing it and the tax burden today is .41¢ on the dollar. I would remind you this is not
