PRESIDENT: Why don't you yield the floor to Senator DeCamp and then we'll come back to you.

SENATOR KEYES: I will. I will yield the floor to Senator DeCamp, till Senator Marvel gets his question.

PRESIDENT: Thank-you. Senator DeCamp, did you wish to be heard on the issue? Senator DeCamp, did you wish to be heard on the issue? Thank-you. Senator Stahmer, your light is on. Your Passing. Senator Snyder, your light is still on. You are passing? All right, Senator Stull, Chair recognizes Senator Stull, the motion before, go ahead.
