PRESIDENT: Question is, shall we read all A bills, shall all A bills be read on June 1? That is the amendment which is before us at this particular time. All those in favor of that motion will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Motion is shall all A bills be read on June 1? Have you all voted? Once again have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 21 nays, 12 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion is lost. Back down to Senator Stull and his amendment to the original Lewis motion which--

CLERK: Motion is (read).

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Stull, closing

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and Members--Members of the Legislature. There's only one reason that I put this amendment on there. I think that we should wait until after we consider the appropriation bills on general file and then we'll have a much clearer picture of what we have, but I think that if we're going to adopt the Lewis amendment why then my amendment to his motion is a good amendment. I'd ask you to adopt my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Question is, is the amendment now to Senator Lewis' motion by Senator Stull and that amendment is to read all A bills. All those in favor of that amendment will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Senator Stahmer, do you have a question?

SENATOR STAHMER: I thought I heard another part to that amendment rather than just read all A bills. Am I correct or incorrect?

CLERK: Yes, the motion is --(read).

SENATOR STAHMER: Is that a dollar number or a numerical number, Senator Stull?

PRESIDENT: --number of the bill.

SENATOR STAHMER: But not the number there on the board? I don't know what that means for sure.

PRESIDENT: Thank you Stahmer, the Chair appreciates the correction. That's the issue before the body. Do you all understand the question? All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. You are voting on the Stull amendment to the Lewis motion which is to read all A bills beginning with the lowest number first. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Once again, have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 24 nays, 13 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: That motion is lost. We are now back to the
