PRESIDENT: Alright. Thank you Senator Duis. Senator Marvel, do you care to respond?

SENATOR MARVEL: I'd like to respond to Senator Lewis in this respect. Rather than to give him the impression I'm trying to play games with the rules and I've already indicated I will support these bills in, in order which I think is fair to the Legislature so with that in mind I will withdraw, withdraw the motion because it simply will complicate us and I guess Senator Goodrich is going to advise Senator Lewis on what to do, but I, I, I intend to vote against the motion at the moment. At the proper I will vote for the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President. I think you can accomplish this without the division of the question. If Senator Lewis desires to do this he could withdraw his motion and then make his motion in separate motion--make this motion separately or allow it to be because I'm merely explaining the, the way you divide a question which is very complicated.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, do you care to respond?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman. First of all, I'd respond to Senator Marvel. I've got advice from everybody else, I might as well get it from Goodrich. The point is and I don't want to belabor it, I think that certainly to pass authorization legislation without the money is ridiculous. I'd suggest to you that if you're not going to vote for 445A, don't vote for 445. I'm not interested in telling people we're interested in giving them money and then not do it. Now, let me say this and I'll sit down, as I close on the motion, I suppose we're ready for that. I wish to proceed with the original motion as I gave it that we vote 445 and 445A. There have been--thank you, Senator Waldron. I'm going to finish. There have been a lot of speculation about dollars available and breaking the budget. My intention is not to break any particular budget. My intention's the same it's been since I introduced 445. I think the bill has merit. I think again, based on the fact that I know each and every one of you, in my judgment all of you have the ability to decide a bill on its merits and have the ability to decide whether or not you want to spend money. I have confidence in each and every one of you that you can make those kinds of decisions. Now I don't have the experience behind me unfortunately, but I do know that this is a bill that should be passed. The time to do it is now. I don't think, in my judgment, whatever happens on the other bill is going to sway me from trying to enforce what the people of the State have said that they want. I think now is the time to face up to this issue. I think today's the day but do not vote for 445 unless you intend to put money with it because the biggest sham that you could pull on anybody is to tell them that you're in favor of motherhood, God and etc., and then not put your money where your mouth is so I think that today is the time to vote on this bill. I think it's meritorious. I think that as my personal discussions with each of you have indicated, you support the bill. Please do not get involved in manipulations and maneuvers on a bill like this. I think the bill is deserved. I think we have
