PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Kelly, for what purpose do you rise? And then DeCamp, then Lewis, then Duis. Senator Kelly.

CLERK: Motion on the desk, Mr. President. I move we adjourn until 9 o'clock A.M., May 15th. Signed, Senator Kelly.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Let's take the rest of the day and cool off a little bit.

PRESIDENT: Wait a minute. The motion was to adjourn until.. excuse me, adjourn until 9 o'clock..what was it, tomorrow?

UNIDENTIFIED: 8:15.

PRESIDENT: All right. The motion before the...well, the question is shall we adjourn until 9:00 A.M., Tuesday. All those in favor of the motion will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? Senator Lewis. Excuse me, Senator Kelly. Once again, have you all voted? Senator Kelly, I don't want to be...the chair doesn't want to be funny but are you really serious about your motion of the Call of the House. I will honor your motion but...OK. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion is lost. Now, Senator DeCamp, for what purpose did you want to be recognized?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, point of personal privilege to explain a vote.

PRESIDENT: All right. Go ahead, sir.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I voted no on 445A because I was trying to follow the posture we have indicated on repeated occasions over the last four weeks that we were going to follow and that was fiscal restraint and very careful and analytical passage of any "A" bills and a few minutes ago, we broke the dam and the thing I guess that confused me was that the men that were leading our effort for fiscal restraint and buttressing the dam suddenly leaped away from the dam and from here on it would appear to be that it's wide open. As Senator Carpenter indicated, he is ready to bring in 30 million more with a bill but he is ready to spend 50 million more with other bills and so I would urge you to really carefully consider what we've done here in the last few minutes. We have broken the dam. Let's see if we can't, at least, hold it at this point without going any further.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis, for what purpose do you want to be recognized?

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I will make this very brief. I just wanted to express my appreciation to the members of the Legislature for voting responsibly for a quality, meritorious bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I want to thank Senator Lewis for that. I certainly hope that he realizes that, probably, every member of this Legislature was for his two bills. Also, want him to know that there were quite a number that wanted restraint in every category including that which they were funding, also. I changed my vote because I was for both bills and I wanted to vote for them but I did at first want the restraint but we do not have it. I am amazed that he did not want the emergency clause for these good teachers, so, therefore, I am making a motion for reconsideration of
