along with our general file and being that today and tomorrow would be the last day to consider bills on general file, I would ask unanimous consent, Mr. President, that the bills bracketed for 5-4, for the 14th, the 15th and the 17th, be placed at the head of general file in those orders rather than being bracketed for those dates.

SPEAKER: You've heard the unanimous consent motion. Is there any objection? If not it is so ordered. Sen-- Senator Carpenter wish the floor, for what purpose?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Matter of personal privilege. I'll be very brief.

SPEAKER: Speak your point.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I would say to Senator Chambers that 529 is germane in my judgment for all the bills that he indicated we ought to consider referring to the people who he indicates run this State and I agree with him. I have my own amendments, I would hope that he could get and I think he can by this afternoon, amendments which would do what he indicates he'd like to propose. Now in refer--reference to Senator Marvel. I'd be the last one in the world who would preclude from him or anyone else from doing whatever they wanted to do but the fact that Senator Marvel did change his vote and to me, did change his position and because of what he is in this body as the head of the Budget Committee and he is an expert in the fiscal affairs of this State and which no one else can even begin to touch him. That is significant. That is psychological and I think that for whatever the reason he did, he did result in the breaking of this dam. I don't say that's bad. I don't know, but I do say that this afternoon we ought to attempt to raise the money that we're going to spend and there's a lot of money we can extract from people today that don't really pay very much. That's what we ought to do and we ought to take care of all the needs of the majority of us want to do. Now this body is based upon self-help among each other. What Senator Marvel and Senator Lewis want, that's fine. What we want ought to be fine too and we help them, they ought to help us and they shouldn't set themselves up in this body as the only ones who can pick out and choose what we ought to pass. This body's a matter of a compromise and when we vote for what Senator Marvel wanted which some of us did hesitatingly, then I think he owes to us and so does Senator Lewis, the support of us in the field in which we think it's important because that's what this body is. Now they, they've brought this thing about, now the least they can do is quit being choosy and to support the rest of us. That's the least they can do and I'm going to look with a great deal of interest how they vote and what Senator Chambers said is true. He and I almost agree in almost everything except he wants to burn the place down and I'm not ready for that yet.

SPEAKER: Senator Nore, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR NORE: Point of pri--personal privilege.

SPEAKER: Speak your point.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman and Members. I think probably we have smoked out the Governor's budget. The people of the State of Nebraska, at least the letters that I get and the folks that I have visited with, do not want the Governor's budget but would like to live with the Appropriation Committee's
