SENATOR CARPENTER: Would the Clerk put that number, 501 down? What's 502?

SENATOR MARVEL: 502 is a bill that, that would get the Department of Health more money by pa--by increasing fees. We, we have an amendment to that bill knocking out one provision and to do with mobile homes. That bill is, is not that urgent. You're asking my opinion, I'm giving you my opinion. It's not that urgent.

SENATOR CARPENTER: 25--256.

SENATOR MARVEL: 256 is capital construction. That's the capital construction bill for this session.

SENATOR CARPENTER: That could last quite a while.

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: 505.

SENATOR MARVEL: 505 is, is the Governor's deficiency appropriation for sewage disposal. Now there's only one, there is a controversy here. The original, the original bill was--appropriated 2.3 million and divided the, the state and local contribution 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ %, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ %. There's a committee amendment on it that w--makes the State 5 and the local 20. There is a controversy there. I assume that if we go along with the way we left 259, then you could knock out the committee amendments and go along with 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 12 $\frac{1}{2}$.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, 505 of necessity would have to be confined to its substance?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now would you have any objection to having the presiding officer put that number, 505?

SENATOR MARVEL: No sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: 582.

SENATOR MARVEL: Now wait a minute, objection to doing what now?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Considering 505 because it's, it's a matter of--

SENATOR MARVEL: No, no I think that's fine.

SENATOR CARPENTER: 582.

SENATOR MARVEL: Well 582 is, is the one that would amend 259. These are basically supplemental appropriations to the Governor's operations bill.

SENATOR CARPENTER: So 582 could be used to amend what we might have done in 259 so pr--

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: So probably we shouldn't put that there. Now, may I make a motion, Mr. President, we consider those bills now--
