SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, I'd like to point out something to the body if I might have their attention. See, the order of business as Senator Proud points out, it really doesn't make that much difference. You know we saved one day for the veto over ride. So if we want to work, all day, on general file we can do that, but then these bills a, would have to be passed on final reading, on the day we were to over ride. So the bills that are off of general file, before that time, then you can have a chance to over ride them. They will be passed on the 25th, but if we want to save some bills, which we don't think there will be a possibility of a over ride. Why don't we work on general file on Wednesday and those can be read then on June 1st, but of course when we come back for the over ride attempt. So we can spend another day on general file for those type of bills.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: I move that we get to general file and if we are worrying about the energy crisis, there is enough hot air already this morning down here to run the State for years. Let's get to it.

PRESIDENT: All right. The chair would like to get to general file, but we have to clear the other motions off the desk first. Are there other pending motions on the desk? Are there any other motions on the desk. All right,--

CLARK: Senator Carpenter you didn't want to take up your motion to return 423 to select file? Ok. That is all Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, the first bill on general file we will consider, but before I move to that will be 579. We have 18, 6th, 7th and 8th grade students and 3 adults here from Hall county, district #3, Grand Island, Senator Kelly's district. Their instructor is Mrs. Doris Voorhees. We're pleased to have you and they are seated up in the north balcony. We hope you enjoy your visit to the Nebraska Unicameral legislature. Now, move on to the general file consideration of LB 579. Senator Marvel, Senator Waldron turn off your light.

CLERK: Legislative bill, 579. introduced by Senator Fellman of the 4th district at the request of the Governor. (read) There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, Senator Fellman, excuse me.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Mr. President, I'd like to yield the floor to Senator Marvel for this.

PRESIDENT: Thank-you. Senator Marvel. You have the floor.

SENATOR MARVEL: I make the motion in order to get to the discussion before the group, that 579 be advanced to E & R initial. If you will note in the bill, section by section depending upon the fund involved, we are talking basically section 2, has to do with the capitol construction fund, section 3, the State building fund, and I will point out another, you have a series of amendments on, starting on page 16, which have to do with reappropriation of money
