I assume that it can be put on here, but it may be necessary in any event that a A bill or something be done on this bill after 533 has been solved, resolved. Whichever way, whichever way it might go. But it would be much simpler I think if 533 was resolved, then you put the funding in to 582 for whatever will fit the configuration of boundaries that exist at that time, but.

PRESIDENT: Well, let's go back to Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: That we move the bill forward when we get through with the amendments. Those who are in a position of, attempting to offer amendments for the same position, same purpose, I would presume that they adopted these, they'll adopt yours on select file. In the meantime, I presume you want to give it some consideration, some study to determine what your position might be. So I had hoped if you let the bill go by, after the adoption or reject of the pending amendments. That you do the same thing on select file and get a hold of the fiscal staff to help you out.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore stand by just a minute, Senator Keyes. All we're considering now is the Proud amendment to the Carpenter amendment. That is the only issue under discussion. The Proud amendment which relates to the eastern technical college. Go ahead sir.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Mr. President, I understand that the schools that Senator Carpenter is thinking about, getting some seed money for, is the same as eastern Nebraska community college, which are not in operation today. Are not having, and they need this money right now to get started in operation and certainly if, under Senator Warner's bill that he should be so fortunate to close up eastern Nebraska, why then the see money would absolutely be defunct, but we need the money right now as the bill is written and as the State is divided up in colleges, we need the money right now, and it needs on there.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, and members, central and northeast have received their seed money so, I support the Proud amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, let's see. Senator Kelly, then Senator Clark, then Senator Stahmer. Still speaking on just the Proud amendment now, to the Carpenter amendment.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the body. I support the Proud amendment on the basis that the \$60,000 seed money needed by the eastern technical college, will work as well if theres 5 district, 7 districts, 8 districts. It won't make any difference that somewhere or other. Eastern has to be organized and eastern has no money in which to get organized with. It is a good amendment in my opinion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Well, this is going to be quite a little change in the whole process till we get to 533. 259 is predicated upon 7 districts, no 8. There is no money in there for eastern in 259. I think what Senator Proud is asking for, is \$60,000 just to operate their board. That is all he is asking for there. Western district has no money to operate their board either. Out there, so I would suggest that we amend it for \$60,000 to operate their board, if we are going to do that up in eastern.
