

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR DICKINSON: How could we get away from this confusion by acting and discussing 533, prior to 584, or 582. Wouldn't this facilitate this whole matter?

PRESIDENT: Well, the chair can't observe on that but maybe somebody else in the body could here. Now hold on, as you have asked each question, you've compounded the complexity here of all of these amendments, and I am not sure that I can thread the eye of the needle here back again as to where we are. But we actually have before this body as this time, the Clark amendment which is for the Western board as I understand it, which involves another \$60,000. That is the amendment now. Let's take that one and discuss it and dispatch it, then we will get back and we'll go back to the Carpenter motion and so forth. Now next to speak was Senator Kremer, then Senator Epke. We're speaking now on just the Clark amendment. This is all. It relates to the western board of \$60,000. If you want to bypass that and don't want to argue that, fine. Go ahead Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I'm sure that a motion would be improper right now. I am going to ask unanimous consent to hold this bill until we dispose of 533. I think it is imperative we act on 533 first. We don't know where we are going. We do not know if we have 5 areas, 7 areas, 6 areas, or 8.

PRESIDENT: Is that 533?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Thank-you. All right.

SENATOR KREMER: I'm not asking unanimous consent. I oppose that have the motion on the floor, would object. We could talk about it, but I feel that it is only proper to take 533 first.

PRESIDENT: Good question. Now Senator Kremer is asking unanimous consent to hold all this discussion and the amendments as they have now been proposed on 582 until we have heard 533. Are there objections to that? I want to know. If you have an objection hold up your hand. Are there any objections? Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: My is not an objection, it is a point of clarification if I might. I think we have enough people here who are in favor of the seeding money, but we're not going to have any trouble on select file. So the suggestion instead of passing over this particular bill, would be to with hold these amendments, go ahead and advance 582 so it is on its way to select file. Then when 533 is dispatched here, then put these particular amendments on 582 on select file and I think that would simplify the procedure considerably.

PRESIDENT: Well, what is your pleasure gentlemen? Do you want, all right. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: If we hold the amendments that are pending on the clerks desk and put them on this bill when it arrives at select file. Now there is one other amendment that I had, when you get through with this that doesn't deal with money.

PRESIDENT: Ok, then the chair understands that we now have unanimous consent to hold 582 with the amendments
