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even if we reduce it to say, now, of course, some of these accommodations are satisfactory but there are possibly two or three hundred people there who do not have satisfactory accommodations which are subject to attack. This is a State institution, not my institution and if the court actions are successful, they're going to have to do something about it anyway, but now the 96 residents in themselves, will take care of 96 but we ought to have double that number to get this thing started. Now it is not likely unless you close completely that we'll ever need less than cottages for several hundred. This is one of the concerns that I have that this has dragged out. Now I, I recognize that we're now going and this is another problem that we have, we're now going to a different arrangement on this capital facilities construction; that is to extend it over from year to year. Maybe this will correct it. Is this going to do it?

SENATOR MARVEL: As I indicated to you that the--that the first amount of money that would be spent would be in this first year, \$17,000,000; the second year \$8,000,000 total, so there is the slack in the second year. Is that what you meant? And also more of a slack in the third year.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Right. Now if we don't get--if we only get six this year and--not very much likelier that we'll get six over the next--six more over the next two years, is that correct, is that a fair assumption?

SENATOR MARVEL: No sir. There's more likelihood that, in my opinion, that you'll get it under this new approach, than you would under the, under the original approach. In other words, a three year appropriation like this gives you more flexibility than a one year appropriation. Was I--do you want me to go ahead?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes, go ahead.

SENATOR MARVEL: As I understand this, what this will do, this appropriation of over a million dollars, will tear down the buildings that are--have been condemned to the oldest on the campus at Beatrice and will move out of those buildings the people that are housed there. This appropriation, in addition to building the six cottages, will also take care of the, take care of the utilities for the additional facilities. In other words, in other words, you're not being penalized on additional facilities that might be built. The connections will be there.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Alright, I'll, I'll go along and of course, next year is next year, but next year I'm going to ask for at least three and probably the remaining six, to get this project underway and I also, while I'm at it, I'd like to urge you, some of you who have never been there to go down there and take a look at this place and see what's going on, to get some idea of what the transition has been. Now this recreation building that is going up is going to be a tremendous asset in the training of these people. It is not just a place to loaf but it is a place for training and it is something that you ought to see what a little money can do. This was only--less than a \$700,000 project which is peanuts as far as we're throwing around money is concerned and I'll, I'll let this pass for the time being.
