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for the same purpose, and so where is it?

SENATOR SIMPSON: We, we have planning money in this budget for an adult diagnostic center. Senator Luedtke has an amendment to the bill that would put a 3 year phase funding to construct it also.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well while we're talking, I want to talk to Senator Wiltse.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wiltse, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have been told, I've talked to you once before about it. Your not very enthused about it and I can understand that, but it seemed to me that to you've got a couple of dormitories in Peru. Which are reasonably well separated from the University itself. It is my belief that you probably at the present time, don't have any particular needs for them. Now I would think that you probably ought to consider that it wouldn't be practical to have your school in Peru, make a survey to see if they by some method during this session and this bill, sell those two dormitories to the State of Nebraska, to be renovated for adult diagnostic treatments. You've got a burden down there as I understand now by a lack of dormitories and I'm trying to help you, not hurt you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wiltse.

SENATOR WILTSE: That is partially correct, but after a survey, we were working on this yesterday in Peru. We found that if the applications come in as we have as prospect, we will have an increase in student body of an excess of 30%. So possibly these will be used. However there is one dormitory building that is completely unused at the present time and could be changed over.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, only as, I would suggest for what it is worth that you try to work out in this session and this bill, you've got time to do it if you want to, to see if we can't sell one dormitory and buy that supplement and maybe others more able to pave their way and it might be the beginning and maybe enlarging an institution down there which would be helpful along with what you've got, and I would hope you would do that because there has been some study already done at my request, but I don't want to do it unless your in agreement with this.

SENATOR WILTSE: Senator Carsten and I are going to a meeting on Thursday evening and we'll be glad to bring this up for further discussion and study.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, did you want to be recognized on this issue? Senator Waldron, do you want to be heard on the issue? Ok, Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I'd just like to comment on what Senator Carpenter has just said in his discussion with Senator Wiltse. The adult diagnostic center is under the comprehensive plan and recommendation of our professional consultants, should be as close to the maximum security institution and the minimum, the medium, minimum security institution as we can get it, because we are dealing here with those individuals who are termed dangerous criminals or convicted felonies, who would be brought in for diagnostic purposes and they should be as close to that institution. Which they would be sent in the Penal Complex
