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SENATOR MARVEL: No, I'd like to go on and start on pages 10 and 11 where the, I assume we'll get some interest on the part of some, because we're getting into higher education which seems to be the controversial area. So I'd refer you--

PRESIDENT: Just a minute, Senator Stahmer, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR STAHRMER: I think he has passed over it.

SENATOR MARVEL: Yea, you want to discuss, why don't you, Senator Simpson would you like to discuss briefly Game and Parks area?

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Simpson. These are still the committees amendments to 256.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the legislature, first of all the appropriations committee felt that there was a need to update the program planning within the Game and Parks commission and to this assembly recommended \$25,000 so that they may come up with a master plan and have it, a systematic capitol improvement program. The next area in the State Parks, requested projects include in historical sites, restoring building of several maintenance shops and some miscellaneous repairs and some fencing that is necessary and the committee recommended \$123,100, in the State Historical Parks, provide a maintenance building and fencing and interpretive centers, \$28,235 and State Recreation areas, establishing access road, regulatory signs and isolation fencing to fence areas you didn't want people into, \$76,500 and in the State wayside areas, change houses and picnic shelters to complete the wayside projects, \$37,200. Administrative facilities these are exterior renovations, site improvements at Alliance district office, the Lincoln headquarters, at Alliance it is watering system and a security fence, a automatic sprinkler system at the Lincoln headquarters. Watering system up in Norfolk and roads and parking renovations and at North Platte they need conversion on a conference room for a total of \$34,500. State special use areas, cash funds for the development of minimum basic facilities, primarily for use for hunting, fishing and wild life values. So we have access roads, boundary fences and markings, picnic equipment, regulatory signs, and very minor amount of acquisition, \$262,500,--and fish and wildlife management facilities, cash funds again for maintenance, renovation and five fish hatcheries Rock Creek, North Platte, Valentine, Grove Lake and Gretna, a total of \$131,880. For the public political subdivisions, the matching, the 25% State matching. It would be a total of \$750,000 in general fund money coming which will generate the total of \$2,930,500 this is assorted and around the State. Building tennis courts swimming pools and other outside activities, and recreation facilities, and that covers all of the money that is going in this budget to the Game and Parks commission.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, back to you.

SENATOR MARVEL: Page 10 and 11. Our recommendation in the life science area at the university of Nebraska, Lincoln, is about \$2,000,000 above the Governor's recommendation. We feel first of all that the square foot costs that the Governor has recommended is unrealistic. But this provides
