for central building for life science activities, including multi-purpose teaching laboratories and provides a minimum of research and office space. We recommend the 3.1 million for the law college. We recommend on the Ag college campus a reappropriation of \$25,000 plus an additional \$225,000 for a detailed plan for veterinary science research building. Plus on page 13 of the bill or the amendments, a million dollars for a veterinary diagnostic center. We also recommend \$134,000 for Curtis, \$106,000 for North Platte including an additional \$100,000 for an addition to their diagnostic laboratory, \$100,000 at Scottsbluff. In Omaha on pages 14 and 15--

PRESIDENT: Stand by just a minute, Senator Epke, do you have a question at this time of Senator Marvel?

SENATOR EPKE: A Mr. President, if I'd like to ask Senator Marvel a question.

PRESIDENT: Go ahead sir.

SENATOR EPKE: As I understand you appropriated \$100,000 for the diagnostic facilities at North Platte. Is that right?

SENATOR MARVEL: That is right.

SENATOR EPKE: And the million dollars is to start immediate construction on a diagnostic lab here at the university?

SENATOR MARVEL: That is right.

SENATOR EPKE: For immediate use.

SENATOR MARVEL: That is right.

SENATOR EPKE: Then the \$225,000 will, will be used for planning to go ahead in another year and start the research facilities?

SENATOR MARVEL: In the University, was a little vague on on this whole area of veterinary science. They originally asked for 7 million dollars for a research building and a diagnostic center and they later cut it down to 5.8 million, and finally after weeks of discussion, the committee decided that first area that ought to be taken care of for the betterment of the State was to set up a diagnostic center so you could diagnose the disease.
