

that they can begin recommend how their campus be used in the future as far as capital construction is concerned. Meanwhile, we recommend \$50,000 for miscellaneous renovation. At Wayne the recommendation for \$75,000, miscellaneous renovation. Also, money for water lines and street repair and for elevators to be used in two buildings to take care of the access for the handicapped. \$110,000 on Page 19, Section 52 be allocated to the Crime Commission. Section 56 is simply an appropriation for the fieldhouse fund in the State Board of Agriculture Improvement fund. Section 20..Section 57 has to do with access to cross an irrigation canal at Kearney. Capitol and mansion repairs is spelled out included a little over two hundred and thirty-two thousand. We thought we ought to spell them out so we could get the Capitol renovated. The final money for the State Laboratory building is found in Section 62. Money for the aerospace museum which includes access roads, parking, sidewalks, et cetera, Section 63. I have already talked about Section 64. Section 65 is \$100,000 for miscellaneous renovation at Kearney and the reappropriation of the money for the Kearney State College, the money was reappropriated and now it needs to be allocated to build the new classroom facility, one million and a half. Provides surfacing for portions of the Coliseum, \$104,000. Raze the Administration Building, \$92,000, and to provide rental or renovation money for Administration and Faculty offices. There is something we need. I'd like to make one other statement. It was referred to when we talked about empty dormitories. I still think when we talk about capital construction, we need to talk about the maximum use
