PRESIDENT: He's shaking his head no.

SENATOR STAHRMER: Would you--would you just recite quickly what it was again then, I must have misunderstood.

SENATOR SNYDER: Senator Stahmer, the fieldhouse, no. That is part of, the committee amended LB 256. No, this is to reinstate the turf and the lights and the additional power necessary for that.

SENATOR STAHRMER: Alright, I misunderstood.

PRESIDENT: We're now debating the Sta--Snyder amendment to LB 256. Senator Marsh. Snyder amendment to 256.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I have a question for Senator Snyder. I am wondering why this was not on the original request that was brought to us by the University of Omaha?

SENATOR SNYDER: Okay. I'll do my best. I had this in a separate bill, Senator Marsh, LB 94. It was agreed, to my understanding, a month ago that we were not going to take any bills on final reading which had to do with fiscal impact once we adopted the, the other budget. In talking with University people and others around the Legislature in the last few days, it was apparent that we were going to have amendments to the capital construction bill so therefore, this amendment proposed by me which would give us the facilities that we had sought through LB 94 at the beginning of the session.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore. We're discussing the Snyder amendment to the committee amendment. Is there any further discussion? Senator Epke? Snyder amendment to the committee amendments here, or to the bill. One that relates to the artificial turf.

SENATOR EPKE: Mr. President, I'd like to have a question answered of Senator Snyder.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder yield?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.

SENATOR EPKE: Would you give me the, the figures once more that you're asking for now for the lighting and for the artificial turf?

SENATOR SNYDER: Alright, Senator, we're talking about a total additional here of \$274,000. This is for the turf, lights and \$25,000 necessary to bring in additional power off campus.

SENATOR EPKE: What, what happens to LB 94?

SENATOR SNYDER: Well, it would become mute.

SENATOR EPKE: Well, it, it would have to be withdrawn or something, wouldn't it?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.
