Committee that we agreed and the way that LB 94 now is, we give you the sum of \$49,000 for the outdoor lighting and \$200,000 for the artificial turf, is that right?

SENATOR SNYDER: That's what that would call for, yes. Now we found that we would need \$25,000 for the ability to bring in necessary additional power from off campus.

SENATOR EPKE: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Snyder amendments? Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Question of Senator Snyder. Do you feel that you have to put this amendment on this bill in order, because you cannot get 94 passed even though it has been correctly engrossed?

SENATOR SNYDER: No, I don't, I don't think that's the case but as I say, I have been operating the last month under the, under the idea that we were not going to take any of the bills on final reading that called for fiscal impact. Now in talking with some people around the Legislature as far as what would be coming out of our capital construction budget, I've had various people tell me that they would support the inclusion of my amendment in--onto the capital construction budget and therefore I placed it on the desk and hopeful that it will be adopted here.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer, do you want to be heard on the Snyder amendment? Alright, Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I'd like to ask a question of Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.

SENATOR NORE: Senator Snyder, now this is in addition to air conditioning the, the fieldhouse and lighting the fieldhouse, the power source that goes to the fieldhouse and acoustical treatment, this is all in addition to that?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.

SENATOR NORE: Which is \$271,000--

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.

SENATOR NORE: --you wa--you want approximately that much more for the outside arena?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Now is there any further discussion of the Snyder amendment? Alright then Senator Snyder may close on his amendment to 256. Senator Snyder is closing on his amendment.

SENATOR SNYDER: Thank you Mr. President. There is no need to really go into great detail. I think we're all aware of, of what I seek here with the amendment to the bill. Again I would stress to, the points that I stressed to the committee that heard LB 94 and that is, we have a landlocked institution. We do not have the space available
