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five and a half million, and this \$5,610,000 total. Now, what this amendment does, the Appropriations Committee did put in the working drawings, the architects working drawings for this project which is where you would get started this year but it only did it on a years basis. Again, referring to what I mentioned before that we ought to be going on a three basis with Penal Correctional Reform so we know that we are on the road and we've got some action, and that we are following the mandate of the Legislature to complete this program by 1975. We request that it be a three year program and that it states specifically five hundred thousand dollars for the year 73-74 and then the construction phase to begin in 74-75 and to be completed 75-76. This will get us pretty much on schedule. It will be a little late but it will be pretty much on schedule. This would be, as I would indicate, the first unit and I understand there is another amendment which, Vince, I assume that that amendment would be next. Senator Mahoney's amendment. We probably should take Senator Mahoney's amendment next and then we would insert in this one that one in the Lincoln are and one in the Omaha Area, but the one that I am proposing, I did not refer to the Lincoln area. If we take up Senator Mahoney's amendment which will mean to build the Omaha Medium Minimum Securities Unit at the same time, then we would designate one in the Lincoln area and one in the Omaha area. Is that correct, Senator Mahoney? So, I suppose the best thing for me to do would be to amend this amendment right now to designate in the Lincoln area on this one and then you can take up your amendment, if that's all right. So, Mr. President, I would amend my amendment by inserting wherever the words correctional facility appear in the Lincoln area in this amendment.

SPEAKER SIMPSON: Have a second? All right. Motion before us is an amendment to the Luedtke amendment and to add in the Lincoln area. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I just want to make a few comments. This was brought about by a study of the Judiciary Committee which I happen to be a member of in which we spent, I don't know, about \$200,000 for a study. Now it is a complete study for example to overlook and over work and remodel and to resurrect a very outmoded operation. It provides for, as has been said, a facility in Omaha and one in Lincoln. It provides for other facilities to be improved or new ones throughout the state. This has been a long time in coming and I think everybody who has been out to the Penal Complex would almost have to admit that certainly this is the time to make a start. Now I think in the area of these appropriations we are attempting to make now, you have to realize that the Governor has appropriated a suggest eighteen million dollars for this coming fiscal year. I don't know to what extent we've complied with his direction from the sense of what we spent it for and then it has been the purpose of others besides myself to spend maybe a like amount to be spent over the next three or four years. Now we can't obligate our successors but the chances are very unlikely that over this period of time that those who succeed us as they will from time to time would be in a position to even have a desire to stop in whole part what are we are probably going to do today and I only give that for whatever it is worth.

SPEAKER: Further discussion on the Luedtke amendment to the amendment. Senator Proud's light is on. Do you wish to speak? Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Yes, Mr. President, it appears to me that we're changing the budget all around and I have no idea where this is going to end up. I'd like to ask the chairman of the Appropriations Committee a question.
