

SENATOR STULL: You think we are too late in the session to do that?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well there is no vehicle at the moment on the board that I know of. 582 has been advanced to select file. That is the only vehicle that I know.

SENATOR STULL: Ok, thank-you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke, all right, Senator Chambers, do you want your motion? Senator Chambers has called the previous question. Previous question has been called for. Does the chair see 5 hands? Thank-you. The question is shall the debate now close on the motion to indefinitely postpone? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Senator Chambers motion is to close the debate. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, no nays, 21 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Senator Proud may close on his motion then to indefinitely postpone.

SENATOR PROUD: Well Mr. President, my motion is made only for this purpose. I don't know how to get you out of here this afternoon without spending the State into poverty, and this is my way of stopping this kind of thing. I realize about how many votes I'm going to get. Now I could care less if I am the only one, that votes for my motion and I ask for a record vote.

PRESIDENT: Record vote a, has been asked for. The question is shall LB 256 be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Motion is to indefinitely postpone. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 28 nays, 12 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion to indefinitely postpone is lost.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Maresh asked to be excused for the balance of the day.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered.

CLERK: Senator Marvel, asked to be excused for the balance of the day.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Have any amendments to the bill?

CLERK: Next amendment Mr. President, is offered by Senator Burbach. Add a new section as follows, (Read) signed J. W. Burbach.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator J.W. Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the legislature, this is continuing a policy which was established back in 1965. In 1965 this body recognized a need of additional funds of and above the 50¢ motor vehicle registration fee for building access roads to recreation areas. If you recall at that time, .7¢ of a 2¢ increase on a package of cigarettes. .7 of a cent went for ETV. That fund has continued to grow and is much larger than the revenue or .7 of 1%. Another fund, the .7 of 1% was established for the land and water conservation act, and this is being continued. In the case of access roads to recreation
