SENATOR SIMPSON: Thank you for the answer. I wasn't sure because I had assumed that maybe Senator Wylie might be back two years from now.

SENATOR DeCAMP: That's my understanding.

SENATOR SIMPSON: He might be asking for more then but in meanwhile I can go along with your project, I guess.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly, we have the DeCamp amendment under debate.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, a question of Senator DeCamp.

PRESIDENT: Well, if you could share the microphone, yes.

SENATOR KELLY: Senator DeCamp, you are moving your request up a year. Did you reach that decision before this log rolling contest got started or after?

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, maybe I'd best clarify that. I actually..two years ago, I was going to try for it but I thought that might not be the right time. Last year, I didn't try for it and the citizens did raise a good portion of the money so the state is only putting up a portion. This year, as you know, for a month we have indicated we ween't going to make any big expenditures and then there was a slight variation this morning and this did have some influence on my deciding to go ahead at this time. Yes.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the DeCamp amendment? The question is shall the DeCamp amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Excuse me, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I don't mind the machine vote but I didknow on the million dollar ones we do it by voice. On the \$25,000, we got to have machine vote.

PRESIDENT: Well, you are right and that isn't all either. The chair suddenly realized that on each one of these that the chair might be just a little vulnerable if we didn't go ahead and take a machine vote and I am pleased that you noticed the aberation. You haven't any votes against you so far. Voting on the DeCamp amendment. Whoops. OK, have you all voted? The clerk will record. I think that's a six.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 3 nays, 30 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: OK, the DeCamp amendment is adopted. Let's take the next amendment. Please not a roll call.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move that \$100,000 be added in sec. 27, page 10. Signed, Senator Stull.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is in the Section that deals with the Games and Parks Commission and this \$100 would be for an air conditioning plant in the main lodge building up at Fort Robinson. I move for the adoption of the amendment.
