

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Stull amendment? The question is shall the Stull amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the Stull amendment. Once again, have you all voted? The clerk will record. The clerk will record. Ok, stand by. Hold the vote just a minute. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 5 nays, 32 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The Stull amendment is adopted. What's the next amendment?

CLERK: The next one, Mr. President, is by Senator Burbach. Read amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as you recall last year, this body made a determination that certain roads in the state would not qualify for access road fro recreation areas and this was one of them excluded. The Brownville plant was another one but there was no contract let on the Brownville plant were there was in this instance. The contract had not been let but it was just ready for the advertising of the bids. The county has spent considerable amount of money in getting it ready in anticipation because it had been approved. We're asking in this amendment that that road be built with funds from the state general fund because of a committment made earlier by the Highway Department and by the Game Commission, and this is not in my district. It is to serve the Northeast Nebraska Experimental park. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Marsh, then Senator Clark.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, a question of Senator Burbach please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, will you yield?

SENATOR MARSH: With all the additional money voted in the last amendment which was adopted of yours this afternoon, isn't there any money in that fund left to take car of this, Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Marsh, no. This would be impossible because of a bill, and I don't remember the number of it, of the last session where a determination was made that only roads to recreation areas be considered by the Game Commission not the Highway Department. Under what authority the Game Commission and the Highway Department accepted that at that time, I do not know. I presume it was the authority of the broader application of the then existing statute but under the new statute passed by this body, several roads here in the state were eliminated because they are not roads to recreation areas and that is why that fund cannot apply. Otherwise, I would be agreeable, at the moment, for that road to be considered. However, we made the determination last year that a halt must be made in that particular area.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark, then Senator Nore.

SENATOR CLARK: Well, I was thinking about building a little addition on my store and I was going to put an amendment on up there for a couple of hundred thousand dollars. I thought it might go through but what I would like to do is talk to myself for a minute because I know darn good well no one is going to listen to it anyway. We took this amendment up of Senator Burbach's. This is for paving a county road. That's all it is for is for paving a county road. Now I've got a county road, it's north of the city and it goes to an Experiment Station out there and I'd just love to have it paved. It's only about four and one-half miles
