I know what happened at that particular time when the Governor vetoed it and a lot of people were disappointed. At this time, I am sure that if you are asking for veto, veto, veto, you are going to get it and I think it is a irresponsible way to do it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore, are you passing? Any further discussion of the Burbach amendment? Senator Burbach, do you want to close on your amendment. Senator Burbach is closing.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well, this..this is important. It is to a state institution. It is a promise that was made and the federal government is going to put in one half of the cost of this road. The county has spent and is ready to spend a little more but I think they have spent nearly \$50,000 on this road already, all in good faith. We're asking to this state institution, this Northeast Nebraska Experimental farm, this is a township road, it is not even a county road, sir. It is a township road but the money has been spent by the county and the federal government is ready to contribute 50% and this is the unmet balance. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the Burbach amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on Burbach amendment No. 2. Voting on the Burbach amendment. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 12 nays, 25 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion is lost. Move to the next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to amend LB 256--read. Signed, Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, this is at Lake Minatare which is a lake belonging to the stat of Nebraska Fish and Game Commission which is the center and the hub of the entertainment and the point of recreation of all western Nebraska
