PRESIDENT: Alright, are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered, amendments are withdrawn. What's the next amendment to the bill?

CLERK: Next amendment is from Senator Waldron. (reads)

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I move for the adoption of this amendment.
