SENATOR WALDRON: That means there is 11 people unexcused and should be around here somewhere. Would the Pages check their offices?

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, if this stays where it is now because there are not 25 votes, do I understand it correctly that there would be amendments which could be passed on voice vote first thing tomorrow morning.

PRESIDENT: It would remain on General File and when it comes up again, that is correct. Any other...

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: At least with this chair presiding, however, there would not be voice vote. There would be a machine vote on any amendment that I handle in this chair tomorrow. Now, Senator Syas, did you want to be recognized.

SENATOR SYAS: Well I just wanted to say that I know that some of the fellows, Senators, have gotten out of here without being excused so I don't think you will find them so I don't know what you are going to do. We can try.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Syas. I am sure you are correct. In the meantime, we are under call of the House. The motion under debate...the motion under vote is whether 256 should be advanced from General File to E & R Initial or not. Senator Carpenter, for what purpose..

SENATOR CARPENTER: To ask for a Roll Call vote. Maybe that will determine whether they are here or not.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Carpenter is asking for a Roll Call vote. Attention please, a Roll Call vote of LB 256. The chair would remind you we are still under Call of the House.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 22 ayes, 11 nays, 16 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 256 fails to advance. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I guess Senator Savage has a motion up there.

CLERK: I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage. All right. Senator Savage have a motion? Is there...

CLERK: We have a motion to adjourn.

PRESIDENT: Just a minute. I had a..I heard a motion out there to raise the Call. Other than that, you are still under a Call of the House. Now what is your pleasure? I was trying to get the vote here please. Now, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I made the motion to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, sir. The motion is shall the Call be raised. Thank you. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw my motion to reconsider LB 445. I visited with the Attorney General and so has Senator Lewis and apparently he is not desirous of paying
