SENATOR GOODRICH: The nursing, for example, is located in Omaha and Lincoln. Nursing is also located throughout the State of Nebraska in some other colleges. However, if there is sufficient demand for nursing training say in Kearney, Hastings, McCook or wherever we happen to have a facility, then let's go

ahead and get it out there, the purpose being to get those kids trained where they are accustomed to being and not bring them to Omaha, get them used to the bright lights and then they refuse to go back home. That's all we're trying to drive, all we're driving at is to get these kids trained in a place where they will wind up staying.

SENATOR KELLY: One final question, Senator. What is a College of Public Affairs and Community Service?

SENATOR GOODRICH: That is quite similar to the SUN program that you've probably read considerable amount about or college via television.

SENATOR KELLY: Now if we're going to have a college that's an institute and that institute's going to have a Vice Chancellor, all of these other new colleges are all going to have deans, is that correct?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now you've got to remember, Senator Kelly, that institute as used in this category, you'll notice Agriculture is already there. Up at the top it says, the University of Nebraska may embrace the following colleges. Now they are, it is a college by virtue of reference up there. We're just adding the word institute down here in front of institute of agriculture. It's a college called the Institute of Agriculture. The only reason for adding the word institute here is because that's the way it was referred to in LB 149 which created the vice chancellorship. You have to have these statutes match each other. Otherwise you're calling it one thing in one section of the statutes and another thing in a separate section of the statutes and it confuses not only the public but the lawyers even.

SENATOR KELLY: Well I'm a member again of the Education Committee and we heard this bill in committee and the University testified and they testified in detail of exactly what they wanted and we gave them everything they wanted in the committee hearings except the ability to establish their own colleges. We reserved that for the Legislature.

SENATOR GOODRICH: And we're still doing that right here.

SENATOR KELLY: Now that was requested by the University too that they establish their own colleges, that this Legislature no longer establish their colleges.

SENATOR GOODRICH: And that was in a previous motion that has been withdrawn. It has been stricken. We didn't want to give them that either.

SENATOR KELLY: This is correct and this bill is now in the very last 30 seconds of the session has to be passed now, it cannot be laid over, it cannot be studied, it is entirely different than the Education Committee heard the hearing on and it would appear to me to be very lax in our duty to the University to pass this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would naturally disagree with you.
