money and it would work out details of the different amendments that different people had whose affect would have been rather far-reaching on the University. So I'd move its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett, do you have a question?

SENATOR BARNETT: Of Senator Fowler. Senator Fowler, one question that I think might clear up a lot of problem, the biggest disagreement that I'm hearing with this bill and I wish you would clarify it is that if we pass this bill with this amendment, we turn the complete responsibility of what schools or colleges are offered over to the Board of Regents. They then have the power to develop these colleges or courses. In other words, we are not dictating what they are going to have offered, isn't that right? We're not going to dictate what the Regents will offer, is that right? Isn't that why the word may is in there?

SENATOR FOWLER: Well, the language is permissive, it says may, funding would have to come from the Legislature to create any new program.

SENATOR BARNETT: That's right, that's what I'm trying to get you to say.

SENATOR FOWLER: Most of these are existing programs already.

PRESIDENT: All right, now gentlemen, we had Senator Fowler close and this body has already voted that the debate will now cease and the chair has to honor that. Now the question is, do you want to adopt the Goodrich amendment? All those in favor of the Goodrich amendment to 275 will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Voting on the adoption of the Goodrich amendment to LB 275. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 6 nays.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: There are no further amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, we're back now to the original bill. 275 as amended. What is your pleasure, gentlemen? Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is to advance LB 275 as amended. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the body, this bill is now entirely different than the one heard by the committee and the big long list of the committee hearing tells the people at the University of, tells the names of the people at the University of Nebraska that appeared of how they wanted their colleges set out in 275 in the public hearing. It would appear to me that they have had a complete change of heart in the deep dark secret dark corners since the public hearing was held. Just that statement.

PRESIDENT: Now is there any further discussion of the bill? Question is, shall LB 275 as amended be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Motion is to advance LB 275 as amended from General File to E & R Initial. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 7 nays, 17 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. That brings up for General File debate then LB 533.
