

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The committee amendments are a result of what the study that Senator Kremer and myself did. We got together with the people concerned and we have taken out some of the objections that power companies and railroads and what they had and we, this is what we call the committee amendments become the bill and it is an agreement between almost everyone concerned and I think it puts it in the proper order and I move their adoption.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion of the committee amendments?

CLERK: Now Mr. President, there are also amendments to the committee amendments, by Senator Waldron.

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, they are very simple. They just clarify the committee amendments. Some of the oversight we have and I move their adoption.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the Waldron amendments to the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor please say aye, all those opposed say no. So ordered, the committee, those amendments are adopted. Now we come to the committee amendments. All those in favor of the committee amendments, as adopted, as amended say aye, those opposed say no. The committee amendments as amended are adopted. Now are--

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, there are further amendments offered by Senator Waldron, to add a new section.

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Let's pass over that a minute. I withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, let's move the bill then.

CLERK: That is all then Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer, do you want to move the bill?

SENATOR KREMER: I move the bill, LB 187 be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is to advance LB 187 as amended. All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye, excuse me, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: 28 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Ok, Senator Marsh. Stand by, go ahead.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to take up 306A, this has been waiting at this location right next for about 3 weeks now on general file. 306 is on final reading and I ask that we
