

CLERK: LB 87 introduced by the public works committee signed by Senator Wiltse, (Read) There are committee amendments by Senator Kremer. Mr. President, it is readvanced to general file. The original amendments which are found on page 638 and 649 of the Journal. We do not have another copy of those amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cal Carsten, what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the body, I'd like to be excuse for the rest of the morning session.

PRESIDENT: All right, are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. President, I move that the committee amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion of the committee amendments to LB 87? Question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted. All those in favor say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. President, I move LB 87 be advanced to E & R for initial.

PRESIDENT: Now the motion is to advance LB 87. All those in favor of advancing the bill, vote aye, those opposed vote no. Better vote again. Clear the board, we'll we've got a mal-- wait a minute, go ahead it is clearing. All right, we are advancing LB 87, if we can get an accumulative of 85, we will do it. We need 25 votes to advance the bill. Have you all voted? We are voting on the advancement of LB 87. The chair is not in a position to plead for votes, but we do need 25 in order to advance the bill. Thank-you. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

PRESIDENT: All right, now the chair is going to accept Senator Waldron's and that is going to be it because we have a motion on the desk to adjourn. Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, I'd like to ask unanimous consent to take up 327 at this time.

PRESIDENT: 327. Are there objections to hearing 327. All right, there is an objection then.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have some committee reports to read in.

SENATOR WALDRON: Could I have 327 bracketed for tomorrow on general file, at the head of general file.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to bracketing 327 on general file tomorrow? Do you object Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: We've taken a whole line of bills out of order today and I haven't objected to it. We have, each of us have some bills yet and I have one that is pretty close up to the top and I would like to take it up. I think we ought to leave them in the order that they are right now.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Senator Simpson, but I've had 3 within a few bills at the top of general file for the last month, Senator and I'm not asking that any of these be brought to the head and that is the only reason that I ask for it to be done that way and I have one just a few bills down that has to be withdrawn yet this session and I have two others there that are close and have been close for the last month. So I don't
