SENATOR CARPENTER: Between 25th and June the 1st.

PRESIDENT: Well, it would be after May 25th. Right. OK. Senator Burbach, go ahead.

SENATOR BURBACH: I understood the Resolution by saying adjournment could qualify between that period of May the 25th, June 31. May 31. It doesn't say adjourn sine die. Wouldn't this be suffice, I don't know.

CLERK: I think he just wanted to delete reference to it and go anytime that you wanted to go.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I don't think we ought to delay anytime. I would agree with Senator Syas. I don't think it requires any time. What I would suggest that Senator Burbach, Senator Kremer, Senator Schmit be a Committee of three in which every other Senator who desires to become a member of the Committee when we will not be in session make the desires to them, they come before the Executive Council tomorrow, which we meet at 12:30. Then the Council will make a determination collectively as to the acceptance of the expense which is nominal in order to send these people to Washington. It will give us a chance to go and come back while this body has not adjourned sine die. So I would move for the motion and let the mechanics take care of themselves.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion. The question is shall the motion, then, be adopted. Those three men that you named were Senator Kremer, Burbach, and Schmit. All right. All those in favor of the Carpenter motion vote aye. All those opposed vote no. This is the vote on the Carpenter motion which is to appoint a special Committee to go to Washington. Have you all voted? Voting on the Carpenter motion which would send a delegation to Washington on the..seeking funds for an alcohol plant construction. Once again, have you all voted? The clerk will record. Speaker Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Is this both ways? Washington and back?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Is the President of the United States wants some official leadership in Washington, then we will be detained longer than that.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, 16 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion is adopted. Do we have other motions on the desk.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, we have some Committee Reports. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports--read. Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports we have examined and engrossed--read. Now, Mr. President, we have a request by unanimous consent to consider bills on Select File at this time. Signed, Senator Carpenter.
