SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E&R amendments to LB 472.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the amendments to 472. All those in favor of adopting the E&R amendments to 472 say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered, the amendments are adopted.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 472 as amended be advanced to E&R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: You heard the motion now to advance LB 472 from select file. All those in favor of the motion say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered, the bill. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Motion is to advance LB 472. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, 21 not voting.

PRESIDENT: 4--472 is advanced.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E&R amendments to LB 267.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the amendments to 267. All those in favor of the motion say aye. I barely heard ayes. Thank you. Clerk--the, all those opposed say no. Motions are--the amendments are adopted.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 267 as amended be advanced to E&R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Motion now is to advance LB 267. Senator Carpenter, do you have a motion on this bill? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: --Senator Warner a question.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Warner, will you yield to a question on 267?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Senator Warner, I think you probably agree to some extent that 267 really doesn't accomplish very much. I opposed it yesterday or when it was before this body. I'm prepared to say now, if you want to amend it or attempt to amend it to a point to make it meaningful, you have my support for whatever that might be and I think to pass it as it is now is much ado about nothing.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Mr. Senator Carpenter, Mr. President, Senator Carpenter, the--I think the bill does have some meat because it does strengthen considerably the requirements for reporting. Now admittedly it does not go as far as I thought would be appropriate to start with but it does have some very spelled out procedures for reporting which we do not now have too clear in the present law and, of course, it has a much, much greater penalty for the failure to report all contributions and expenditures which is removal from office. That was, the present law is a small monetary fine.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of 267? Senator Cavanaugh, we're ready--267.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move that--
