PRESIDENT: Well, the first motion would be to unbracket 423. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, Mr. President, let me first ask Senator Whitney a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Did I express correctly my opening statement the facts involved?

SENATOR WHITNEY: I think you did if I heard properly. I think you did, and I did appreciate your attitude here and I appreciate your asking me if I wanted it brought back on select file. I appreciate that very much, but I feel, I have a feeling that there is going to be a lot of opposition to that amendment even though it would pass on select file, by the time it got to final reading. Therefore, I hope that we could find some other place for that amendment.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, let me close Mr. President, to say that whatever you do, in the determination of unbracketing the bill ought to reflect your idea whether or not you are going to discuss and attempt to realistically amend the bill. I'm sure you understand what is in the amendment. I'm sure you have been contacted by people who are for and against it, and time is some importance to this body, I will not have any further closing, no further comments. I think the issue is well known and I only ask for a record vote on the motion. To bring the bill back with the belief that if you bring it back, then you are going to support the amendment. If you are not, that ends it.

PRESIDENT: Well the motion, Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I'd like to speak on the amendment just a moment. I understand that the State college administration is not in favor of it as it is now. They would prefer if it be a change to some extent and I feel that this point should be taken into consideration, therefore I hope you vote to not to bring it back for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Is the bill being unbracketed first?

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR GOODRICH: That is the motion at hand right now?

PRESIDENT: Motion at hand right now, is shall LB 423 be unbracketed?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Fine, I have no objection to unbracketing the bill.

PRESIDENT: Now, question is, are there any objections to unbracketing 423? Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered and the bill is unbracketed. Now the motion before the body is to return 423 from E & R engrossing to select file for specific amendment. That is the issue before the body.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Now you are saying something different. You are saying that we are voting on returning it. Are we voting
