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for me, my responsibility is to look out for her welfare and I intend to do that, any feelings by me, anybody in this body, notwithstanding. The rest of you women can do as you please, but I will tell you this much. If any of you have any problem along that line and nobody else will assist you, you come to me and if nothing else can be done, perhaps, some public embarrassment will correct it. And here is where I will close. Suppose some white women in this body who didn't want me to put my hands on her came and told you that I patted her on the butt.

SPEAKER: Senator Chambers, if it is agreeable with you, the speaker will check into this matter just as soon as possible. Is that agreeable? All right. Mr. Burnett. Now, Mr. Burnett is here. You can ask him any questions you desire. I have several lights here. I assume you are asking for the floor. Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Mr. Burnett, if it is possible, I would like to ask you this question. If we had a bill on General File that would, I feel, be noncontroversial and would pass without any particular debate in any way and was needed to clarify some language and some things that I feel the body would go along with. Could that be done and still have time not feeling that the Governor would have any objection to it in the override, as to wouldn't

SPEAKER: Can you get his speaker turned on there, please?

EMORY BURNETT: I didn't think I was making much noise. That bill could be reported to Final Reading on the 88th legislative day which would give the constitutional layover day, the 89th, could then be passed on the 90th. The problem would be if there are numerous such bills or if they are long and complicated. It would be the difficulty for me of getting large numbers or difficult and complicated bills across, in addition to those that I now have.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Well, the reason I was asking was the agreement with our full Committee the bill is on General File and I had asked if we had some controversial, non-controversial bills that might be brought up but we didn't get to that and I felt that under the circumstances and the criticism that we have had that I would like to have the opportunity and if it didn't get over there, it still wouldn't be suicide but I felt maybe you can handle it if it didn't come under that jurisdiction of the veto.

EMORY BURNETT: I would feel that unless my instructions are changed, I would have to carry that at the bottom of the stack.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Yes, and I would appreciate that.

EMORY BURNETT: ..there would be a question of getting to it if I possibly could.

SENATOR KENNEDY: I would appreciate that.

EMORY BURNETT: And I say that I probably could.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Ya.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, this morning I am going to go through the conversation because it seems that when I made a statement in here some people, my credibility was questioned. At least, I felt that way by the Senator from Scottsbluff for one, so I will start out. When I asked you this morning and you said, as I understood it, that due to yesterday you had all you could handle to get these bills that are now on
