initial over for Final Reading under the schedule that we now set up. I was not talking, of course as you know and I know, about the 90th day. I was talking about the schedule we now have and you said it would be nip and tuck to take on any additional workload under the schedule that we have adopted, is that correct?

EMORY BURNETT: That is correct, Senator. Yes sir.

SENATOR SYAS: So, but Senator Kennedy is asking about the 90th day which we did not talk about, isn't that true?

EMORY BURNETT: We did not discuss the 90th day.

SENATOR SYAS: That's right. So, therefore, I told the Senate today that if they advanced any bills from General File, it would have to be with the understanding that under our schedule that they'd have to stay on E & P Initial until next session. If they advanced any more bills from General File, they couldn't get to Final Reading until next session. Let's put it that way.

EMORY BURNETT: No. No, that's not..I don't think..

SPEAKER: Can everybody hear...

SENATOR SYAS: I mean in the schedule we've set up, in the schedule.

EMORY BURNETT: All right. If you are to save a veto override (inaudible)..

SENATOR SYAS: No, I'm not talking about that. I'm talking about in the schedule that we come on the veto override and not use it for Final Reading day. I'm talking about in the schedule, that the bill could not..you could not get it for the normal schedule which is the 89th day.

EMORY BURNETT: I told you that the chances of getting anything more would be very slim.

SENATOR SYAS: That's right.

EMORY BURNETT: I did not say that it was absolutely impossible.

SENATOR SYAS: No, that's right but you also said it was nip and tuck the way it was at present.

EMORY BURNETT: It looks that way to me right now, yes.

SENATOR SYAS: Thank you.

SPEAKER: Senator Mahoney, were you asking for the floor? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Let's be more specific. If we went back to General File, in your judgment, how many bills can we pass off General File and expect them to be on Final Reading in time to be read, or do you have all you can handle now?

EMORY BURNETT: On the 90th day..on the 90th day, Senator?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Any day.

EMORY BURNETT: I would have to see the bills because as I mentioned to Senator..in response to Senator Kennedy's question, these bills differ a great deal. A short simple bill I can take care of in a matter of minutes. I worked LB 563 today. I started working at noon and I worked straight through until 2:30 on it and the girls are now typing it.
