SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Emory, I have LR 8 on General File. Is there any deadline on that.

EMORY BURNETT: LR 8.

SENATOR MARESH: It has been there for..yes, it's a constitutional amendment to ask that Congress be elected for four years and I wondered is there any..I didn't take it up yesterday because I didn't want to interfere with bills. There is no problem with that, is there?

EMORY BURNETT: A Resolution is not going to interfere with my bills, Senator.

SENATOR MARESH: Then it could be raised anytime..I mean advanced anytime from General File.

EMORY BURNETT: It might...

SPEAKER: The chair is going to have to follow the Rules, I am sorry to say. The question..the motion has been made to adjourn and unless the mover wants to let somebody else speak, I am going to put the question.

UNIDENTIFIED: The question.

SPEAKER: All right. The question is to adjourn. All those in favor say aye. Those opposed no. We stand adjourned.
