CLERK: 41 ayes, 0 nays, 8 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. Attention please, now, for the Final Reading of LB 542.

CLERK: Final Reading. LB 542.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached. Allthose in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: Vote read. 41 ayes, 0 nays, 8 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. We have 25 students from Wynot High School from Senator Burbach's district. Mrs. Carr and Mrs. Halvorsen are the instructors. They are up in the north balcony and we are very pleased that you have chosen today to come down to visit the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature and your Capitol city. CLERK: There is a whole stack of stuff, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right. We have a batch of business on the desk there to clear off so stand by while we take care of the business on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, an explanation of vote--read. Mr. President, notice of Committee Hearing--read. Mr. President, a letter addressed to the Honorable Allen J. Beermann--read. A communication from the Attorney General addressed to the Honorable Ernest Chambers--read. Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review--read.

PRESIDENT: Just a minute. The chair recognizes Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I am wondering of Vince, the bills on Final Reading for tomorrow are probably not any real extremely long ones in there, are there?
