

I agreed to discuss these all and I have something like 10 motions here. So I can discuss individually and 10 times 10 is 100 minutes. PRESIDENT: Alright the motion before the body is that the a...a..Senator Proud be able to exceed the 10 minute limit. Senator Waldron was on his feet first. Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President I speak against Senator Proud's motion for a very simple reason. He spoke 30 minutes on this same motion just a few days ago and it was clearly discussed at that time. I know that he has the right to make these motions and if he wants to exercise the kind of leadership that he has demonstrated this year by talking on all 10 motions then I have more power to him. I will be glad to listen to him for the rest of the day if he wishes to talk.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, the motion before us is that Speaker Proud be allowed to speak on....

SENATOR CARPENTER: IN ORDER to allow him to talk as long as he wants too, as long as he reasonably confines himself to a subject that is broad. Now Senator Proud is smart enough to know that there are methods by other motions which he can accomplish what he wants to do. Now this is a body of free expression to Senator Proud this is an important issue. He has his rights but I would hope that when his time expires that if you adopt this motion then, that that will cease the debate then we will vote. Is that agreeable Senator?

SENATOR PROUD: Oh yes, I'm willing to vote on them one at a time or all and when I finish the speaking here then except in some kind of rebuttle I have said my piece in regard to all of these motions.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well now I would object to voing on them one by one because that takes further time.

SENATOR PROUD: It will be agreeable to me to vote on them all at once, because the motion is to return them to Select File at which time they can...we can pick and choose or do anything we want.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move to amend...and Senator Proud is our Speaker and I think that he is entitled to more privileges beyond that which applies to the rest of us. By honoring him with this title he has those things which are rightfully his. Lets give him all the time he wants to explain his position and then when he gets through lets vote on it.

PRESIDENT: Well the Chair would feel that the motion should be shall the rules be suspended and the Speaker then allowed to go for more than 10 minutes.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I so move to suspend the rules and let him go as long as he wants.

PRESIDENT: Do you wish to speak to the motion Senator Whitney?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President....
