

PRESIDENT: We are now under a call of the house. The next bell please indicate your presence. Chair would remind you that we are under a call of the house. Asking you to indicate your presence please. Motion under vote of course is the return of LB256 from select file for specific amendment. Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: A point of order Mr. President. I assume that if it gets back to Select File then we will take the items one by one, if anyone wants too.....

PRESIDENT: The Chair would so rule. Senator Duis we are under a call of the house. The motion under vote is the return of 256 from Select File. Senator Carpenter for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARPENTER: My understanding was that if we put it back there the motion ought to take them all off.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: My understanding was than we take them all as to whether we a were going to send them back to Select File and that is what we have done. Now if that is the judgment of the body that we take them off when we get it there that is just fine with me. It makes no difference, this body as you know Senator does whatever it wants to do and if I made a promise to that affect I'll keep it. I thought that I was proposing was that instead of voting on them one by one on my motion that we voted them all back to Select File and I believe that I even said at that time that then we could take them one by one if you wanted too. It is whatever the body wants to do.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter let me clarify that. The Chair's position on this a

would be and I have conferred with the Clerk that we can consider all of these amendments, consider them all without having to flip flop the bill back and forth and with all the Mickey Mouse motions between Select File and E & R engrossing. In other words the bill can reside on Select File and we will take up all the motions one at a time in chronological order as Senator Proud has mentioned them or has them up here and the point being that the Chair would feel that it is not fair to offer all of those amendments at one time and as a matter of fact I think that then it would be out of order to offer those but that we would consider them each one each time separately.

SENATOR CARPENTER: It is my understanding that if they come back we consider them as a whole. If they did not deny that then he could do anything he wanted one by one. Otherwise we will be here for a long time for example. Lets make a ...if the body wants to accept them all fine, if you don't want to accept them and consider them individually you are on your own.

PRESIDENT: That is fine with the Chair too, but it would take some vote in order to consider them all in one vote. In other words the Chair would rule that at this point they have to be taken in chronological order at one at a time unless a motion
