

is made by the body to consider them all in one vote. If you do that then and the motion carries the Chair would honor that motion. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President on a point of order it seems to me that the rules state that you must bring it back for a specific motion. One specific amendment. Now if we are going to separate the question then we have a many specific amendments and it would seem to me then that it would take then a suspension of the rules and bringing it back for 30 votes to return in order to do what you are now stating.

PRESIDENT: Well if it takes 25 votes to bring the bill back and then the next question would be on procedural order. After we get the bill back. Motion under vote now of course is the return of 256 from Select File to....

SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, I request a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Proud is asking for a roll call vote. Senator Carpenter for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I think that Senator Simpson has a point. Now I'm not trying to delay this, if the body doesn't want this money why repeal it. If you want to be pushed in the corner sometimes as I attempt to do, as he attempted to do this morning on a basis of false economy, which doesn't reflect the truth at all, I don't have time to discuss that right now but I will when you get it back on Select File if that is where you want it. But I would think that technically you would have to put it back for each amendment which I don't like to do. Now if the Chair rules that is not so and the ruling is alright I certainly wouldn't move to over ride it. What is the Chair ruling?

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter I was temporarily distracted because a Senator got up out of their seat and was moving around over here and we are under a call of the house and it is awful hard to watch everything and listen too, I'm sorry I didn't catch your motion or didn't catch your question. Would you restate it please.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I only want to make a point of order and I don't want to force it but I think that Senator Simpson is correct in his interruption or interpretation of the rules. I want the chair to outline that he does or does not Simpson's opinion that to move a bill from E & R and back to Select File you have to do it by specific amendment for specific purposes. Now whether you can broaded that enough to take care of all of the amendments I would question.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would concur that is an aboration of the rules. I'm not sure that I am that technically prepared but I would feel that once the bill has been returned that it takes 25 votes to return the bill and then I would consider if the rules chairman would consider discussion on this that there is a possibility of a technicality that the rules should be suspended in order to take up all 25 motions, or excuse me, however motions that he has on the bill at this particular time. I would think that it would require a suspension of the rules however, I would think that anytime 25 members would order to take these in that order all in one group, that I would stand by that, unless someone objected. If someone objected, then I would say that we would have to go to the suspension of the rules. I think that it is a very technical point and....

SENATOR CARPENTER: I don't want to make it so I move Mr. President
