

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Senator Marvel speaking in broad round numbers we the Governor of the state of Nebraska recommended in the area of capital construction 18 million dollars, is that so?

SENATOR MARVEL: That is right.

SENATOR CARPENTER: How much did this body spend?

SENATOR MARVEL: You mean with the floor amendments? Are you talking about the total now?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Total yes.

SENATOR MARVEL: 21 MILLION DOLLARS.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Then we spend about 3 million dollars more than he recommended. Is that true or is there some modification of that?

SENATOR MARVEL: Just a second. This is what I thought but I wanted to double check before I answer the question. In order to compare the Governor's budget recommendation for this year, this next year this is all that we are talking about one fiscal year. Compared to what the legislature has done at the moment, the Governor's recommendations are roughly 22.6 million. Because you have got to add in the 3.6 million that comes from the cigarette tax that goes to the field house and to the state fair. Ours is 21.2. So we are below the Governor when you add all of these things up at the moment for 1973-74 by a million, four-hundred thousand dollars.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Is it basically true that really the only difference is that we didn't follow the Governor's recommendations as to what ought to be built in the field of capital expenditures.

SENATOR MARVEL: I think that it goes beyond that and I would like to explain that since you asked the question.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I think that this is important as to how we vote I think that we ought to vote on the facts and not things that are not facts which would lead the people of this state to the television and the members of this body to assume something that is not true. We are not wild spenders we didn't do this, we didn't do what you think you are doing. Now you ought to know what you are going to do before you do it. I'd

SENATOR MARVEL: I will answer the question and I would like to have the attention of the legislature, and I would like to have you refer to the sheets that were passed out if you still have them and I'm talking basically about the four page a hand out and I will tell you what my analysis of it is and I hope that there are some that will add to this. Now in the Governor's recommendation for 73-74 you are talking about his initial recommendation of 18.3 million. Now the Governor in his recommendation in his capital construction bill put in theoretically all of the money that he was going to spend or that was going to be spend on these major projects at one time for one year. Now when what was the number of your bill, 467? I'm trying to get the attention of the legislature.
