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a in my opinion responsible sources of the need for money in the dental college. I have had no contact of any kind requiring more money in the medical college. I picked up the suspicion that this \$200 or \$300,000 was hashed at the same time the amendment to LB275.

PRESIDENT: Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, members of the legislature, all this is is merely another quarter of a million. IN fact it is more than a quarter of a million as far as I am concerned it is being done without rhym or reason and I was a...a..I would further suggest as a matter of parliamentary procedure that everybody that wants to spend should now jump in because this is the way it is today and probably will be tomorrow because if you promise to vote for a spending bill then you they have got to vote for yours and vice versa, you know. So this is the way it is today, spend, spend, spend. I am going to vote against this and I call for a record vote.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, did you wish to be heard on the issue? We have the other part of the Schmit amendment.

SENATOR MARVEL: I'll give you whatever information that I have. I would like to remind you first of all that when we are talking about the University of Nebraska whether we are talking about the Med School, the Omaha subdivision or the Lincoln campus in the Governor's budget there is a 1% discretionary fund. When we are talking about the dental college well lets say this that Chancellor Zumberg on the Lincoln Campus has \$251,000 he can do what he wants to with it. The 1% of salaries is a similar fund that is available to chancellors on the other campuses, and you ought to keep that in mind when you are talking about appropriating money. Now Senator Schmit if I am not correct, you can correct me but the information that I have we had a little bit of trouble with the fiscal staff having to talk with me and also those people who are proposing the amendments so I am assuming that they have complete before the day is over. There are 215 residents at the moment and the Governor provides for 15 more in his budget. That is 230, and I am told that is all the hospitals of Omaha will take. This loads them up. Now it is fine to put residents to fund residents if they can be taken care of. If they can not be taken care of that is another matter. I think that they have the residents that they asked for, and they have the residents that the request they presented to us in this room and this adds up to 230. As I understand your amendment this would add another 15 residents to the total of 230. So that is the information....that is all the information that I have that the Governor's budget adding 15 residents will take care of the facilities of the Omaha hospitals who are cooperating with the Omaha Med School.

PRESIDENT: Senator Anderson.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, Senator Marvel has answered the question that I have so I pass.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Schmit amendment? Alright Senator Schmit you may close on the other half of your amendment.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I would like to say this in closing that when I asked Dr. Dan Kogel if they could handle them he said that they could. Now whether...there has been a lot of conversation about Omaha and Lincoln and there has been some conversation
