I would think that this would be adequate for the time being in order to restructure and to require enough air craft and to renovate those which they have and put into flying condition in order to do and to take care of the purpose that they have before the amendment to the civil air defense bill and should be an attempt to fund them to a part to make it realistic with this is a general overall application of the policies of the state of Nebraska in this specific field. I move for the adoption of the amendment.
